

MORE THAN WORDS 2024 Open Poetry Competition for Young People and Open Short Story Competition for Young People - rules for entry

- 1. These two competitions are open to anyone living in a North Somerset postcode who is 14-18 years of age only.
- 2. Entrants must be in full or part-time education at a school or college
- 3. Entries must be typed (1.5 line spacing preferred), written in English and:
 - a) Poems must be no more than 40 lines in length (excluding title)
 - b) Short stories must be no longer than 500 words (excluding title)
- 4. Each entrant may only submit one poem/one short story.
- 5. Do not use offensive, discriminatory language, or language promoting hate speech or violence, in your poem or short story. Doing so will lead to disqualification.
- 6. Your name, or any other identifying marks, should not be added to your poem/short story.
- 7. The poem/short story must be your own, original work and should not have won another competition or been previously published in print or online.
- 8. No changes will be permitted once work has been submitted.
- 9. These competitions are not open to any person affiliated with Clevedon LitFest, partner organisations or their immediate relatives.
- 10. Entries not following these rules will be disqualified.
- 11. The judges' decision is final and no feedback will be given.
- 12. Keep your own copy of the work as entries cannot be returned.
- 13. Copyright is retained by the author.
- 14. Prize winners will be notified by email to your parent or teacher and will be invited to attend a prize giving event in Clevedon in November 2024 (details to be confirmed).
- 15. Clevedon LitFest reserves the right to publish video footage, screenshot images and/or photos gathered from the prizegiving event on its website and social media platform accounts. You must inform us if you wish to opt out of this.

How to enter:

- a) Your entry can only be submitted by email, as an attachment.
- b) The subject line must be one of the following:

For poetry entries: 'Poetry Competition - Young People 2024



For short story entries: 'Short Story Competition - Young People 2024'

- c) The body of the email should include your name, your age, a title for your poem/short story, your contact details (including the first part of your postcode for monitoring purposes), the school/college you attend, and an email address for your parent and/or teacher.
- d) If you are submitting an entry for the Poetry Competition and an entry for the Short Story Competition, you must send each one in a separate email with the appropriate subject heading.
- e) Send your email/s, with attachment/s, to: competitions@clevedonlitfest.org.uk
- f) If entry details are NOT completed as above, an entry may not be accepted.
