This first screening of **The Salt Path** at the Curzon is a special one, when bestselling author Raynor Winn will join film producer (and Curzon patron) Elizabeth Karlsen for a post-screen Q&A. We are delighted to be including this as part of our Making Waves festival, in partnership with the Curzon.



The life-affirming story **The Salt Path** has been adapted into a major film starring Gillian Anderson and Jason Isaacs (directed by Marianne Elliott and written by Rebecca Lenkiewicz).

This is the profound true story of husband and wife, Raynor and Moth Winn's 630-mile trek along the beautiful but rugged South West Coast Path. After being forcibly removed from their home, they make the desperate decision to walk in the hope that, in nature, they will find solace and a sense of acceptance. With depleted resources, only a tent and some essentials between them, every step along the path is a testament to their growing strength and determination.

In Conversation with Raynor Winn

Raynor Winn is the author of three Sunday Times bestselling memoirs: **The Salt Path**, **The Wild Silence**, and **Landlines**. Her books have sold over 2 million copies worldwide and have been translated into over 25 languages. Her debut **The Salt Path** won the Royal Society of Literature's inaugural Christopher Bland Prize and was shortlisted for the Costa Biography Award and the Wainwright Prize for Nature Writing. **The Wild Silence** was also shortlisted for the Wainwright Prize. In 2024, the Sunday Times listed **The Salt Path** as one of their top 100 books of the past 50 years.

Raynor is a regular long-distance walker and in 2024 walked the London Marathon to raise awareness and funds for Corticobasal Degeneration research. She writes about nature, homelessness, our relationship to the land and the health benefits of walking. Raynor lives in Cornwall with her husband Moth and is currently writing her fourth book.

Co-producer of the film, **Elizabeth Karlsen**, is an internationally renowned filmmaker, BAFTA winner for Outstanding Contribution to British Cinema, and co-founder of Number 9 Films. Her work has garnered a total of 52 BAFTA nominations and wins, along with 20 Academy Award® nominations and wins, and the Curzon is incredibly fortunate that Elizabeth is a Patron.

There is fresh love for folklore, fairytale and myth, that can exclude saints' legends, perhaps seen as products of a medieval faith that could be tyrannical. But the people shaped it too, cramming into walled cities to show their devotion to relics and sharing stories on badges they wore on their hats and bags; stories that drew on and helped shape the folklore and fairytale we love. Celebrating the ambiguity of stories generated by the European cult of saints, from its birth in Late Antiquity, to its demise in the Protestant Reformation.

Writing and illustrating books inspired by medieval culture, Amy Jeffs has a PhD in Art History. Her most recent book, **Saints: Medieval Legends of Heroes, Humans and Magic** (2024), grew out of a fascination with the medieval pilgrim souvenirs found in the Thames.

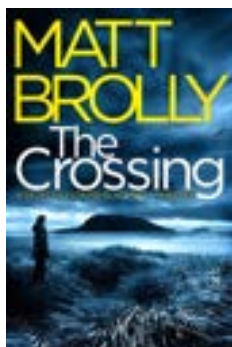

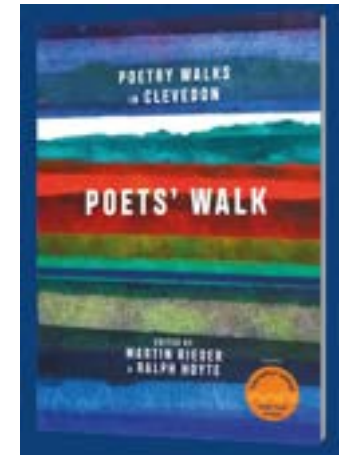
The walk is triggered by GPS locations on a route around the route of the existing Poets' Walk.

Celebration of the Book

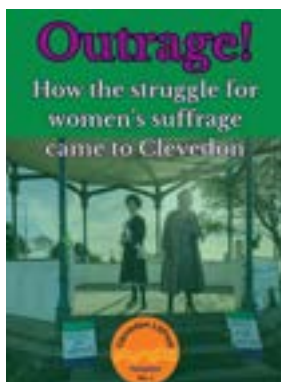

In March 1914 Clevedon's historic St Andrew's Church was the subject of an arson attack - which appeared to be a protest by suffragettes campaigning for women's voting rights.

Following on from our successful, and hugely enjoyable, collaboration with Show of Strength Theatre, which culminated in two promenade performances of **Outrage! Or the Ghost of Mabel Hunt** last October, the background research to the story has been used to produce our first pamphlet.
